

Communication Technology Studies 10

Communications Technology 10 emphasizes communication and presentation. Throughout the course students will be engaged in a variety of productions aimed at communicating a specific message to an intended audience. Various forms of media used include: video/audio equipment and computer related technology.

Students will acquire basic skills using simple audio and/or video equipment and techniques. Productions may include:

- Demonstration of appropriate camera movement;
- Demonstration of appropriate use of special effects and studio techniques;
- Television editorial, commercial, news broadcast, and music video
- Audio productions including radio broadcasts

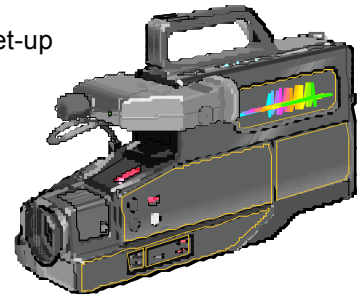
Students will also complete a variety of computer related productions aimed at communicating a message in a well defined presentation format. Productions will include:

- Creating presentations using a variety of multimedia including print, graphics, audio, and video;

The student will:

- Identify basic audio and video equipment and demonstrate fundamental set-up procedures;
- Identify and demonstrate basic audio/video concepts eg. Camera moves, types of shots, audio mixing, audio set-up;
- Apply basic project planning skills to audio/video productions;
- Apply scripting, sound recording, and camera and lighting skills and techniques in completing a production assignment;
- Demonstrate basic competencies



Student Evaluation

Final marks in the course are applied to three distinct Career and Technology Studies credits. Students will receive a mark for each. Some assignments may apply towards more than one credit and students may be working on more than one credit at a time.

Expectations

- Student must be responsible and accountable for your own learning. Respect the learning environment and the needs of others--be creative within the guidelines provided.
- Student attendance is vital to success in the course. Individual and group productions are dependent on a cooperative and supportive environment. Students who are late or miss classes can impact on the success of others;
- Exams, missed or late assignments will render a mark of zero. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that a parent/guardian notify the teacher/school if the student has been absent with a valid excuse.
- Students who are absent when called upon to complete or submit a production will not be rescheduled without a valid excuse.

- Plagiarism will result in an automatic mark of zero.

How the program works

- Com Tech students may work on a number of different projects at any given time.
- Students are assigned a computer and provided with course materials.
- Work is completed individually with assistance provided by the teacher. Cooperation is vital!
- Some projects are done individually, some in groups.
